Rules

- Closing date for entries is Monday 31st January 2023.
 PLEASE NOTE: There is no late entry date and late entries are at risk of NOT being accepted.
- 2. Age limits are determined as at 1st September 2022.

 In group classes where age limits are stated, the age of the eldest young person will denote the class entry.

3. Classes.

- a. There is no limit to the number of classes for which a performer may enter, but where categories are offered (i.e. Preliminary, Primary etc.) only one category may be entered.
- b. **GRADED CLASSES**: a performer may enter TWO graded classes, one for which they hold the grade and one higher.
- c. **NOVICE CLASSES**: The qualification for entering a novice class is that the entrant should be Pre-Grade 1 and **MUST NOT** enter Grade 1. Performers in a Novice Class **MUST NOT** perform a Grade 1 piece of music.
- d. Performers may not make more than one entry in any solo class, but in duet and trio classes they may enter more than once, if accompanied by a different person and that person will not be performing elsewhere in the same class. A piece of music must not be repeated, even if being performed with a different partner.
- e. Performers must only be entered within their grade. If duet/trio partners are of different grades, the entry must be made in the highest-grade category, e.g. duet/trio partners of Grades 2 and 4 must be entered in a class which caters for Grade 4, or Elementary/Intermediate partners must be entered in a class which caters for Intermediate.

TEACHERS AND PARENTS ARE REMINDED THAT CARE SHOULD BE TAKEN TO ENSURE THAT PERFORMERS ARE ENTERED IN THE CORRECT CLASS ACCORDING TO THEIR STANDARD.

A general guide would be:

Novice = Pre-grade 1
Elementary = Grades 1 - 3
Intermediate = Grades 4 - 6
Advanced = Grades 7 - 8

- f. Winners of classes **MUST NOT** perform the same piece the following year (excluding Dance entries).
- g. **CHOIR CLASSES**: Where a Year Group is specified, younger children may enter the group, but the entry must be made in the age range of the eldest children. Where number on roll is specified, if the school roll is very close to the specified number, consult the Festival Office for guidance.
- h. **NON-COMPETITIVE CLASSES**: performers in these classes will receive a written adjudication and a Festival certificate, but *no* marks and *no* trophy.
- 4. **RESTRICTIONS**: Performers who in the 6 months prior to the Festival have been pupils of an Adjudicator appointed to the class in which they have entered, will be ineligible to compete.
- 5. **TIME LIMITS**: Where a time limit is imposed, marks will be deducted for an over-run. It is not necessary to perform to the upper time limit.
- 6. **ORIGINAL COMPOSITIONS** in music, poetry or prose *must* accompany the entry form. These will be timetabled for performance and discussion, although the performance need not be by the composer.
- 7. **COPIES OF OWN CHOICE WORKS:** The Music Publishers Association Code of Practice on photocopying copyright works make a concession for copying own choice pieces FROM VOLUMES ONLY for the use of the adjudicator at a festival, provided that the entrant or participant has already purchased their own copy. Photocopies for the adjudicator must be completely legible or they can be refused.

Any photocopy will be retained and destroyed by the Festival Organiser immediately after the close of the class.

Single copies of items may not be photocopied without the prior permission of the copyright holder.

This permission does not apply to music for the accompanist or competitor, who must always perform from a printed copy, except where copies are required to avoid page turning.

Competitors are advised that this permission applies only to copyright holders who are members of the Music Publishers Association, listed at the back of the Code of Practice leaflet, obtainable from the Association at 103, Kingsway, WC2B 6QX. It is the competitors' own responsibility to ensure that they seek permission to copy direct from any copyright holder whose name does not appear in the list. Own choice titles and composers **must be** submitted on the entry form.

8. PUBLISHED WORKS & SET PIECES

There must be no re-arrangement of published works.

Difficulty in obtaining a set piece should be notified to the Festival Office immediately.

9. **RECORDED MUSIC**

Entrants using recordings created from commercial recordings are advised that they should themselves seek permission to re-record from the record companies concerned. The Festival cannot take responsibility for this.

10. SONGS FROM THE SHOWS – VOCAL ENTRIES

All performances using music from shows in current production are subject to copyright law. Songs from shows in current production may be sung as a concert item, *i.e.* with no costume or movement, without need for copyright permission.

11. CONDUCTING OF SPEECH & DRAMA

Conducting of performers, either verbally or facially by teachers/parents is not allowed.

IF A PERFORMER IS CONDUCTED, MARKS WILL BE DEDUCTED.

Performers should be adequately prepared, with no prompting required.

Gestures/actions in the poetry speaking classes are only permitted in these classes.

12. MUSICAL THEATRE (excluding Dance entries)

The following *must* apply

- Time limits are strictly adhered to
- It is not a complete act of a musical play
- It does not constitute a 'potted version' of the musical play
- It is performed without any change to either music or lyrics and using only the published or authorized musical arrangements
- There is no use made of any form of scenery, costume, choreography, staging, character representation or special lighting which gives a visual impression or other portrayal of the writer's original conception of the work from which the excerpt is taken

13. TUNING

Performers in brass & string classes must complete their tuning outside the Auditorium, where possible. Those over 15 years of age must carry out their own tuning.

14. PROFESSIONALS & RETIRED PROFESSIONALS

Solo classes are not open to professional or retired professionals. A limited number of professionals/ retired professionals may take part in an instrumental ensemble, orchestra or choir, if they do not receive payment. In chamber groups of up to 10 persons, only one to be professional. In larger groups, the professional element must not be more than 20%: 10% in the case of brass bands.

For the purpose of this Festival, professionals/retired professionals are defined as those who derive or have derived the bulk of their earnings from remuneration for work in that branch of the Arts with which the competition is concerned.

15. PHOTOGRAPHY, FILMING, VIDEO, TAPE-RECORDING, DIGITAL RECORDING OR RECORDING BY ANY MEANS IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED.

General Information

A. OFFICIAL ACCOMPANIST

It is not possible for an accompanist to be provided for this year's festival. Performers should organise, rehearse and perform with their own choice of accompanist or backing track. The Festival Office can provide details of persons willing to accompany. It will be the performers' responsibility to contact that person and make their own arrangements for rehearsal and payment. Please contact Encore Enterprises CIC (lisa@encore-enterprises.com) if details of persons are required. All arrangements should be made prior to the Festival submission deadline.

B. FESTIVAL PROGRAMME & TIMETABLE

Each performer requires a Festival Programme to ascertain the time and day of performance. The Festival Programme will be available mid-February online here: Physical copies will be available each day of the festival at a cost of £4.

Performers should carefully consult the programme as the Festival accepts no responsibility for performers being unaware of their performance day and time.

C. PERFORMANCE TIMING

Performers entering more than one class should check to make sure there is not a clash of timings, and, if there is, they should contact the Festival Office immediately. Performers must be ready to perform, two performances before their allocated placing in the class.

D. ENTRANCE TO VENUES

All performers, teachers, accompanists and conductors must make themselves known to stewards.

Parents and others in any way connected with the performers, are *not* entitled to free admission and must purchase a ticket on the door. Tickets are £5.

E. FESTIVAL ETIQUETTE

Performers and audience are reminded that whilst they are waiting for adjudications, there should be little or no movement around the hall, conversation should be kept to the minimum and eating is not allowed. Teachers and performers MUST NOT communicate with the adjudicator during the session.

F. AUDIENCE

The Festival accepts no responsibility for members of the audience missing a performance. The position of performers in a class may be changed on the day for various reasons and withdrawals may mean the class will close early. To ensure that no performance is missed it is advisable that persons wishing to be present for a particular performance are present at the venue at least 5 minutes before the commencement of the class. No class will commence before the published time. Tickets will be available at the door on the day of performance.

G. DUTY OF CARE TO YOUNG PERSONS

Parents and teachers are reminded that the safety of young people in their care is their responsibility during the Festival. The Festival Committee have done their best to ensure that you can keep within eye contact throughout the Festival. Staff at venues cannot accept responsibility for young people not in the care of a parent or teacher.

H. DISCLAIMER

All attending the Festival are reminded to take care of their personal property – handbags, instruments, etc. The Festival cannot be responsible for loss.

I. OBJECTIONS & APPEALS

Any objection or appeal must be made to the Festival Organiser, in writing, immediately after the result is announced. It must be accompanied by a deposit of £5 which will be returned if the appeal is allowed or not considered frivolous. The Committee's interpretation of the Rules and its decision on any point shall be final. Verbal abuse will not be tolerated.

J. FESTIVAL CONCERT

K. AWARDS

Adjudication Sheets and certificates should be collected at the end of each session. Certificates will be awarded to all performers. Up to and including trio classes, individual certificates will be awarded.

For larger groups only one certificate will be awarded. The marking will reflect the moderation of marks matching national standards and will be as follows:

Adjudicators

Speech & Drama

Alan M Hayes B.Ed (Hons), GODA

Since professional training at Italia Conti Stage School, and a B.Ed (Hons) through London University in Theatre and Education, Alan has directed over a hundred stage performances. After professional acting engagements in TV, radio and stage, he worked as acting/stage manager in weekly rep at a London Theatre, before assuming the role of Head of Expressive Arts in a large comprehensive school, managing over twenty Arts Staff. Alan has also served as Principal Examiner and Principal Moderator for Drama with the AQA Examination Board.

He was appointed as a member of the Guild of Drama Adjudicators in 2008, and has recently completed a term as vice chair of their steering committee.

Rebecca Vines

Rebecca read journalism at Cardiff University, during which time she wrote a weekly column for The Guardian newspaper. She continues to work for a range of publications as a features writer, ghost writer, and theatre critic. Rebecca then studied as an actor at the London Centre for Theatre Studies; and her theatre credits include off-West End, Fringe, tour, educational theatre and voiceover.

Rebecca trained as a specialist drama teacher at The Guildhall. She has taught in a range of primary, secondary and tertiary educational institutions for the last twenty years and is the Principal of her own drama school which operates internationally. Rebecca's pupils have been awarded places at major conservatoires and bodies including RADA, LAMDA, Central, Royal Academy of Music, Royal College of Music as well as many others. Their work can be seen on the BBC, ITV, Sky, C4, E4, Netflix, Working Title, National Theatre, RSC and countless touring theatre companies in the UK and abroad.

Rebecca sits on the Adjudicator's Council for the British and International Federation of Festivals, and also on the awards panel for the British Pantomime Awards. She is a LAMDA, GCSE and A level examiner.

In 2014, Rebecca was awarded the prestigious Fellowship of the Royal Society of Arts in recognition of her work in the youth theatre sector. Rebecca is passionate about helping performers take their first professional steps and helps emerging talents to form and manage their own theatre companies.

Rebecca is delighted to be coming back to Hereford in 2023. Her family have a long and happy association with the county and some lovely memories have been forged here.

Woodwind and Brass

Paul Harris

Paul has established an international reputation as one of Britain's leading music educationalists. He studied at the Royal Academy of Music, where, as a pupil of John Davies, he won the August Manns Prize for outstanding performance in clarinet playing. He has taught in the UK, the USA, the Far East, New Zealand and Australia and has undertaken research into specialist music education for the highly talented.

He has many publications to his name, mostly concerned with music education. His book, "The Music Teacher's Companion", won the UK's Music Industry Association's Best New Book award in 2001. He writes for many national and international journals and made an appearance in the final Inspector Morse novel!'

Choral & Vocal

Luana Godwin

Luana grew up singing as a lead chorister in the Bath Abbey choir and was a regular soloist for surrounding areas. She studied her BMus (hons) at the University of Edinburgh and continued to complete her PGCE in Music at the University of Bristol.

Alongside her singing career, she has been a secondary music teacher in two schools, more recently an international school in Dubai where she co-directed the production *Little Shop of Horrors* and conducted multiple choirs whilst teaching private voice coaching. She has also won multiple voice competitions through the years around the southwest area.

Piano & Keyboard

David Gaukroger

In his 20s David played piano and harpsichord with the CBSO, BBC Welsh Orchestra and the Scottish Baroque Ensemble. He has given recitals in Asia and South America and at many English Festivals. David has been Chair of both the Hong Kong and Bangkok piano competitions.

David has composed in many media, including the children's piece, Romany Wood, which has been performed over a hundred times, including two Royal Charity Gala concerts, in the Classic fm evening concert, in four Symphony Hall concerts and in six cathedrals, including York Minster. In 2009 Romany Wood was chosen to open the new Theatre Severn in Shrewsbury.

David created and introduced England's first National Diploma in Rock and Jazz and appointed Robert Plant of Led Zeppelin as Musician in Residence. His last teaching was at Sunfield, a residential school for children with complex learning needs: typically the pupils exhibited profound autism and challenging behaviour.

Strings, Classical Guitar & Harp

Katy Latham

Katy studied the violin and voice at the Royal Academy of Music. She has played with many of the leading orchestras in the country, including the BBC Philharmonic, the BBC Concert Orchestra, the BBC National Orchestra of Wales, the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra and the Ulster Orchestra. For two years she had a full-time contract with the orchestra of Welsh National Opera.

She has played with many of the leading ensembles in the South West, and is a member of the Minerva String Quartet and the Ystavaa Piano Trio. Until recently, Katy was a regular leader for the Brandon Hill Chamber Orchestra in Bristol. Katy has taught the violin for many years and is currently teaching at Badminton School in Bristol, where she enjoys teaching pupils at all levels, many from overseas. She also enjoys coaching Chamber Groups and has been a tutor at Bristol Pre-Conservatoire as well as for the South West Music School.

In 2018, Katy started training to be a counsellor, having completed initial counselling courses at Weston College. In September 2021, she was offered a post as one of the counsellors at Sidcot School, in North Somerset. She now combines counselling work with music and is looking forward to a future involving these two 'worlds', both personally and professionally.

Rock & Pop

Pete Fletcher

Although his musical education and training are in traditional Western Classical music, Pete has always had a love of popular, film and stage music. This was fostered at Methodist College, Belfast by an entrepreneurial music teacher who used suitable pupils for studio recording sessions and professional theatrical productions.

Throughout his teaching career, Pete remembered the opportunities he had been given at school and tried to give similar experiences to his pupils at Belmont Abbey, St. Mary's RC High School and latterly at Hereford Sixth Form College. From the 80s he had been eagerly adding computer music to his interest in tape recording, and at last at HSFC he was able to teach Music Technology as an A level subject, helping several students on their way to careers in the music, theatre and film industries.

Now retired from teaching, Pete is still active in choirs and bands, composing and arranging music for both, and directs the Hereford Big Band. He was very pleased to be asked to adjudicate this class of the HPA festival and hopes it will encourage young people to strive for excellence in popular music as much as in the classical sphere.

Dance

Katie Glover

Katie started dancing at the age of 4 at a local dance school after mithering her mum for weeks to go to tap dancing lessons. At the age of 15, she went to Elliott Clarke in Liverpool where she studied ISTD Tap and Modern and RAD Ballet. At the age of 19, she went on to study a BA (Hons) in Dance Studies at John Moore's University, thereafter gaining a PG Cert in Dance Theatre Practice at LIPA.

She then went to train part-time at NLDA (North Liverpool Dance Academy) under the wonderful guidance of her teacher, Cathy Conroy Jones, and gained ISTD teacher qualifications in Tap, Modern Theatre and Imperial Classical Ballet. She has passed ISTD Fellowship Tap, ISTD Licentiate Modern and is currently studying for her ISTD Licentiate Ballet and Fellowship Modern with the intention of becoming an examiner for the ISTD.

Katie has trained at the George Ferguson School of Irish Dancing where she won the Class championship and performed at The Liverpool Empire Theatre. She had her own inclusive dance school for 14 years where she taught ages two to seventy four. Tap is her first love and she was in Tap Attack Associates for 10 years which she thoroughly enjoyed.

Katie is also Acrobatic Arts qualified, Dancing Memories qualified and Allied Dancing Association qualified. She was a member of Birkenhead Operatic Society Trust (BOST) and performed in many musicals at the Liverpool Empire Theatre including the UK tour of Joseph. She has sung at numerous charity events and has made two CDs to raise money for Autism Together.

She has adjudicated all over the UK and for the ukdcc and for the ukdcc medal tests. She is also an adjudicator for the TDCI.
